This year we will also be running staff and parent support groups twice termly for Autism, Dyslexia, Down's Syndrome and Cerebral Palsy.

<p>Monday 31st January 3.45 – 4.45 pm (virtual)</p>	<p>Post 16 – Raising Awareness</p>	<p>Basic autism awareness training for everyone involved in a post 16 setting who would benefit from an understanding of autism.</p> <p><i>This includes teaching and support staff, office staff, caterers, caretakers, transport staff, governors, employers and careers advisers.</i></p>
<p>Wednesday 2nd February 3.45 – 4.45 pm (virtual)</p>	<p>Interoception Awareness</p>	<p>Interoception is the 8th sense, that helps you feel what is going on inside your body and it has a huge impact on self-regulation, mental health and social connection. Many children with ADHD, Autism, Sensory Processing Disorder, experience interoception difficulties. This training will look at how we can teach these children to connect with their body signals so that they know when they are developing emotional reactions and to develop the skills to be in control of these reactions.</p> <p><i>This training is suitable for all staff supporting students with SEND across Primary and Secondary settings.</i></p>
